- 7. "Stay Safe" is a Canadian Red Cross course teaching 9-13 year olds how to stay safe at home

and in the community. First Aid elements include recovery position, conscious choking, asthma, anaphylaxis (includes use of EpiPen), poisoning, stings, wound care (minor cuts, nose bleeds, burns, life-threatening bleeding). The 5-hour course will take place during school hours on March 13th, 2020, for approx. 110 students in Grades 6 & 7. Course cost is \$40/student. PAC will cover \$15/student; families will cover \$25/student.

MOTION: to subsidize \$15 per student from the Gaming Account (approx. 110 students in Grades 6 and 7 - ~\$1650.00) for "Stay Safe" Red Cross First Aid course.
