- 4. No Parking Zone along 6th and along Trimble & Dangerous crosswalks at Queen Mary (Laura)
 - The issues:
 - People consistently parking in the no-parking zones
 - People consistently parking beyond the signs
 - Pedestrians of all ages find it difficult to cross to the school and back, especially at 6th and Trimble, as they can't see if traffic is stopped and cars can't see if there are pedestrians
 - Pedestrians crossing diagonally at 6th and Trimble
 - U-turns occurring in front of the school
 - Quadra preschool has 2 parking spots for staff in front, plus they have young kids going in. They have no stopping signs by Quadra, but yet lots of people are there to park
 - Active Transport Week was a big success
 - In the past QM had parents (and ? students) as crossing guards, but stopped this because they had conflicts with driveers
 - How can we get to a place where we have safe drop-offs/pick-ups?
 - Comments/Suggestions from attendees:
 - Erin: Could the older kids at QM be crossing guards? It could be a leadership opportunity
 - Elyssa: in the district, there is the ability to have students trained as crossing guards

- Natalia: we used to have grade 6/7s doing the crossing guard duty, but doesn't feel like this would be safe
- Elyssa: the crosswalk at 5th is more visible and less bad behaviour so perhaps this one would be better to have the older kids be crossing guards at
- Could there be more Active Transport weeks?
 - Elyssa: we do have a week in spring which is a Bike to School Week
- Sandra: Perhaps we could ask the city for help for the intersection such as a 4 way stop, re-painting the lines and/or flashing crossing?

• Laura: can ask this through 311

- Amber: is it usual for there to be no parking in front of a school like we have?
 - Elyssa: the no parking sign means that you can't leave the car if you are stopped there, however people frequently park and leave there car in the no-parking spots. Some schools, like downtown, have no parking at all available in front of the school
- Elyssa: since we have a lot of new families at the school, it would be good to provide messaging about parking/traffic safety in other languages
