 - Have had one already
 - Terry Fox Run was on Sept.21
 - Coming up
 - Cross country
 - K-7 the only extra-curricular that involves younger students
 - M/W/F mornings for practices plus mini-meets
 - $\circ \quad \text{Orange shirt day} \\$
 - Saturday, Sept.30 is National day of Truth and Reconciliation
 - This week in classes teachers have been spending time talking about Indigenous people and harms that have been done
 - Friday, Sept.29 will be an assembly and children are encouraged to wear an orange shirt
 - The school has been given a lot of books by Indigenous writers about Indigenous topics and stories that teachers can access
 - Lunch update
 - Made changes from last year this year having lunch in the multi-purpose room, except for Kindergarten, Grade 1 and Mrs.Miles' Grade 1-2 class
 - The children drop off their lunch bags in the multipurpose room before going outside for lunch play. They come off the field for lunch at 12:40 and the teachers take them back to their classes at 12:57.
 - Based on feedback have already made changes: Added an extra table
 - She is very impressed with the kids during mealtime
 - Some feedback about kids not finishing lunch in this set-up: she is hoping as the kids adjust that things will improve but will be reviewing hand-washing stations as that might be holding up some children, as well as meeting with the teachers to discuss
 - Hot lunch info
 - Trying to figure out how hot lunch will work given the change to the multi-purpose room
 - She is going to wait to a bit
 - She noted that there has also been a request for more than 1 day
 - Hiring teacher for Division 5
 - \circ $\,$ 13 divisions last year and now 14 divisions so need to hire another teacher $\,$
 - o Fairly significant teacher shortage in Vancouver
 - \circ $\;$ District hires into a pool and she hires from the pool

- Have an amazing teacher on call that has committed to be here every day until teacher is hired
- FSA (Foundation Skills Assessment) information
 - o FSA is for Grades 4 and 7
 - The FSA will occur in October and is provincial wide
 - Super intendent sent email to all parents
 - Has a numeracy section online and paper based portions, and a literacy section with an online and paper based section (4 sections total)
 - Purpose is to get an idea of where students are at
 - Important at both school and district level: Informs instructional and planning cycles
 - o Our participation rates are really low in Vancouver, so hard to act on the results
 - Also tells students where they are at, where they are going and how they will get there
 - Assessed in a 1-4 scale, same as report cards, so in a familiar format for the results
 - Encouraging students to participate
 - Results are not shared with the classroom, but teachers may look at if they want, so there is privacy
 - o Done on site
 - \circ ~ Each section is about 45 minutes to 1 hour ~

- Ongoing year-round fundraisers details can be found on PAC website
 - Mabel's Labels: they make labels for clothing, sports gear, lunch gear, household items. Free shipping. QM receives 20% on every purchase
 - Cobs on W Broadway: mention that you would like your purchase to support QM as you are paying and they will donate 5% back to our school
 - Stong's grocery store on Dunbar: order groceries online for delivery or pick-up and choose QM during check-out and they will donate 4% back to our school
 - FundScrip purchase gift cards/cards for your own every day use and QM will receive a donation back to our school. Over 230 retailers participating

 - Curriculum is a 2 year curriculum from Saleema Noon. Idea is that if we do it now (November) we can postpone for 2 years. The same content is in grade 4 as in grade 5, for example, so that's why we have it every 2 years typically

- Teachers felt that fall would be a good time to have the sessions this year
- Question from PAC member: Is there other providers? Elyssa answered: Yes, but such great success and content meets curricular guidelines. Teachers would need to look at content of other providers. If we want to explore other provider would need to allow time to do that. Teachers could also provide the teaching. Saleema noon has been used around school districts for a very long time
- Options Education is another provider
- Last year paid for from gaming grant
- Discussion brought up from PAC member: since only 6 months ago is this too soon and could we use the money for something else? Ie keyboard typing, cooking class
